



Food and Beverage Policy (Visitors)

1. Purpose

FDNA encourages customers to purchase and consume food and beverages at Jubilee Park Stadium. Accordingly, this policy identifies the areas in which food and beverages may be consumed.

This Policy aims to ensure the safety all visitors and staff on site and manage potential allergen and/or bacterial risk.

2. Scope

The policy covers consumption of food and beverages within the Stadium and aims to ensure that Visitors and staff are aware of what is allowed and what how non-compliance will be managed.

3. Definitions

Terms “food”, “drink” and/or “beverage” can be used interchangeably and include both singular and plural use; and refer to anything consumed while on premises at the Jubilee Park Stadium (“the Stadium”).

4. Procedures

4.1 Food and beverage permissions:

Food and beverage may be bought and consumed by users within the following designated areas of the Jubilee Park Stadium:

- Cafe
- Function Room
- Meeting Rooms
- Outside courts

Food & beverage brought from offsite may only be consumed outside the Stadium.

Athletes may consume drinks related to their on-court activity, beside their court/activity.

4.2 Food and beverage prohibitions:

In order to manage contamination, bacterial/allergen risk and slip hazards, food from home or any other retailer is prohibited, unless by prior arrangement.

(Drinks for sporting participants may be brought in closed containers and consumed directly adjacent the sporting court/activity)

- Food & beverages may not be consumed by Visitors on any sports surface.
- Food & beverage should not be consumed in circulation spaces where people need to move freely.
- Food & beverages must not be consumed in toilets/changerooms.

4.3 Prohibited drinks

Alcoholic drinks are not permitted, to all patrons under the age of 18 years. Alcoholic beverages sold by FDA as part of an approved function and within the approved Liquor Licence red line space will be managed by the FDNA Liquor Licence Nominee. Compliance with relevant government legislation and regulations will be maintained.

FDNA discourages the consumption of energy drinks due to the alleged health risks associated with some products. FDNA will not offer these drinks for sale in any outlet.

4.4 Water

FDNA will provide free water, available to all visitors via the drinking fountains provided around the indoor sports courts.

4.5 Liquor Licence signage

Signage around the Stadium demonstrates the requirements and penalties for inappropriate behaviour in relation to:

- Responsible Service of Alcohol
- Underage drinking

4.6 Compliance

Any visitor who does not follow the direction of this policy will be reminded of the conditions of entry to the Stadium.

FDNA will always take an educative approach first. Visitors will be provided an opportunity to clarify any misunderstanding, and an agreed time frame to make changes.

Subsequent refusal to follow direction may result in the visitor being asked to leave the Stadium.

Visitors are reminded that it is a condition of entry to the Stadium that all patrons adhere to FDNA Policies and Procedures.
